Read the first page to children. Encourage them to read along.

Ask children to read the rest of the book aloud.

Ask children to point to one or two words they know.

Support children if they have trouble reading a word by using some of these prompts:

- Look at the first letter. Get your mouth ready to say it.
- Look at the picture. What is happening?
- What word makes sense here?



Reread the book aloud together and talk about it.



Build language and comprehension by using the ideas at the back of the book.
