The setting sun glowed behind the trees. Rosie stood on the porch. As it got dark, she tried to turn on the light. The bulb was burned out.


Then Rosie saw a strange creature.

"I think I saw a Bigfoot!"








All about

Describing Bigfoot


Researchers say a Bigfoot is 6 to 12 feet (2 to 4 m) tall. It weighs up to 1,000 pounds (454 kilograms). Witnesses say it is covered in fur and is very smelly.

People say Bigfoot creatures sometimes throw rocks. They might scream or **howl**. But they are also **shy**. They run away from people.

How much does a Bigfoot eat?



A small Bigfoot would need about 7,200 calories a day. That would be about 24 slices of pizza.





Researchers know of about



researcher (RE-surch-uhr)—someone who carefully studies something

shy (SHI)—feeling nervous about meeting new people

sighting (SIHT-ing)—spotting something **track** (TRAK)—a mark left on the ground by an animal, person, or vehicle

witness (WIT-nes)—someone who sees something happen
