What do you think Alex should do?




Which one would you choose? Why would you choose that?

Do you think Alex made a good choice? Why do you think that?




There is a new girl in class today. Isabella spots her sitting all by herself at recess. Isabella feels shy about talking to her. But the new girl looks so lonely.
