Glossary

acceleration (ak-SEL-uh-ray-shuhn): The process of moving faster; gaining speed

collision (kuh-LIZH-uhn): A sudden and violent striking together of two objects, such as moving vehicles

cruise control (krooz kuhn-TROHL): A system that automatically controls the speed of a vehicle

gasoline (GAS-uh-leen): A liquid fuel made from oil and used to power internal combustion engines

icon (EYE-kahn): A person or thing widely admired for having great influence or importance

internal combustion engine (in-TUR-nuhl kuhm-BUS-chuhn EN-jin): A machine that makes a car move by burning gasoline in an enclosed space, producing hot gases that drive pistons

luxurious (lugh-ZHOOR-ee-uhs): Comfortable, elegant, and expensive

models (MAH-duhlz): Types or designs of products; carmakers produce many car models

production (pruh-DUHK-shuhn): Mass-produced and available for sale to anyone; not custom-made

SUVs (es-yoo-veez): Abbreviation for *sport utility vehicles*; rugged vehicles built on truck frames
